Mayor Tony Burriss opened a Beer Hearing to hear any comments pro or con about Sunday Beer Sales. Tim Jones with Jones Service Center came before council to make comments in favor of Sunday Beer Sales. Jacob Flowers, manager of Little General, also made comments in support of Sunday Beer Sales. With no other comments Mayor Burriss closed the Beer Hearing at 5:33.

Trenton City Council

A regular scheduled meeting of the Trenton City Council was called to order by Mayor Tony Burriss. The invocation was given by Alderman Hammonds. Mayor Burriss welcomed all in attendance and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Those present were elected officials, Alderman Abbott, Cannon, Gibson, Hammonds, Jackson, and Overall. City employees present were Sammy Dickey, Will Sanders, Barry Green, Ricky Bailey, Terry Bailey, Terry Brown, Jenny Corbin, Richard Gossum and Bret Fisher. Those present as visitors were Jacob Flowers and Tim Jones.

Alderman Cannon made a motion to approve the minutes of the March 24th meeting. Alderman Jackson seconded the motion. The motion was passed by all.

RECORDER'S REPORT

City Recorder, Sammy Dickey, gave a report on the 10th of the month bills. The 10th of the month bills were Electric \$618,213.64, Water and Sewer \$22,429.59, General Fund \$30,367.92, and Sanitation \$5,622.23. A motion was made by Alderman Jackson. Alderman Hammonds seconded the motion. The motion was passed by all.

SUNDAY BEER SALES

After some discussion by council members about additional revenue, Alderman Cannon made a motion to allow Sunday Beer Sales from 12 p.m. – 6 p.m., package only. Alderman Gibson seconded the motion. The vote was 4 yes and 2 no. Aldermen Overall and Hammonds voted no. The motion passed.

REPORT ON FIRE FIGHTER TRAINING COMMITTEE

Alderman Hammonds made a motion for the committee to allow training at the city's expense. The committee recommends this expense for Fireman 1, 2, and 3, First Responders, and Haz Mat training 1 time annually. The consensus of the council was to allow the training.

RESOLUTION #2009-R-5

Resolution #2009-R-5, Interlocal Agreement and TML Risk Management Pool Corporate Charter, is a resolution that must be passed for the city to do business with the Tennessee Municipal League Insurance Pool. Alderman Cannon made a motion to pass Resolution #2009-R-5. Alderman Jackson seconded the motion. The motion was passed by all.

BLACKTOP BIDS

Cantrell Construction Company's bid was \$86.00 ton in place. Martin Paving Company's bid was \$80.60 ton in place. Alderman Hammonds made a motion to accept the low bid. Alderman Abbott seconded the motion. The motion was passed by all.

BOARD OF ZONING AND APPEALS

Alderman Jackson made a motion to appoint George Wade to a 4 year term to the Board of Zoning and Appeals. Alderman Gibson seconded the motion. The motion was passed by all.

PLANNING AND ZONING BOARD

Alderman Cannon made a motion to re-appoint Jimmy Williams, Barney Cayson, and Danny Jones to 4 year terms on the Planning and Zoning Board. Alderman Hammonds seconded the motion. The motion was passed by all.

RICKY BAILEY / BUILDING INSPECTOR

Ricky informed council that he sent 4 notices of compliance. Three of the notices did not comply in 30 days. Four more notices were sent for 30 day compliance.

TERRY BROWN / PARK DEPARTMENT

Terry informed council that there had been a fight in the park; two people have been banned from the park for 1 year. Alderman Gibson made a motion to allow the ban. Alderman Hammonds seconded the motion. The motion was passed by all.

WILL SANDERS / POLICE DEPARTMENT

Will reminded council of the crash scene April 23rd. If it rains, it will be held on April 24th.

BRET FISHER / LIGHT AND WATER DEPARTMENT

Bret informed council about a proposal from Lashlee Rich to be construction manager for roof repair at the utility district. Their fee will be 10% of the construction bid. A motion was made by Alderman Overall to allow Lashlee Rich to oversee the roof repair. Alderman Hammonds seconded the motion. The motion was passed by all.

Bret also informed council about a proposal change in deposit from bad credit customers. The regular deposit is \$200.00 and will add \$100.00 extra for these customers. This change must also be approved by TVA. A motion was made to approve the change by Alderman Cannon. Alderman Hammonds seconded the motion. The motion was passed by all.

Bret needs to have a Utility Board Meeting to adopt a policy of customer cut off. This policy needs to be adopted by the next council meeting. There will be a Utility Board meeting Wednesday, April 22, at 12:00.

OTHER BUSINESS

Alderman Gibson stated that he has been receiving complaints about speeding on Lexington Street between 8th and Armory Streets.

Alderman Hammonds stated that Trenton has been offered cameras for speeding at no cost.

Alderman Abbott stated that the rib eye sandwich sales raised \$1300 for the baseball league.

Mayor Burriss reminded everyone that on May 25, Memorial Day, the cemetery committee will dedicate the gazebo at Oakland Cemetery.

With no other business the meeting was adjourned at 6:24 with a motion made by Alderman Hammonds. Alderman Jackson seconded the motion. The motion was passed by all.
