A regular scheduled meeting of the Trenton City Council was called to order by Mayor Tony Burriss. The invocation was given by Alderman Cannon. Mayor Burriss welcomed all in attendance and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Those present for the meeting were elected officials, Aldermen Abbott, Cannon, Gibson, Hammonds, Jackson, and Overall. City employees present were Sammy Dickey, Bret Fisher, Will Sanders, Barry Green, Terry Bailey, and Jenny Corbin. Present as visitors were Lanny Poteet, Murray Jones, Hank Warren, Susan Featherstone, and Katrika Nance.

A motion was made by Alderman Cannon to approve the minutes of the August 10th meeting. Alderman Jackson seconded the motion. The motion was passed by all.

STATUS OF PROPERTY GIFT FROM TOM MILLIGAN

Mayor Burriss informed council that Phase I has been started on the property. Acu Lab of Jackson is doing Phase I. If Phase I comes back clean the property will be the city's because the vote has already been made by council.

FLOOD VICTIM TAX RELIEF
