Trenton Officers Solve Several Burglaries

Trenton Police Chief Will Sanders told the Gazette that on March 6, 2008 Lieutenant Dusty Vickers and Patrol Officers Will Williams and Anthony Robertiello, while responding to a burglar alarm at the Gibson County Farmers Co-Op, located on Manufacturers Row in Trenton, observed an individual coming from behind the building as the officers were checking the security of the building. The officers took the suspect into custody and continued to search the area. Upon further investigation the officers found that entry was made on the North side of the building by breaking a window. Employees of the Co-Op were called and it was not determined at the time if anything was missing.

The officers determined that the person taken into custody was a juvenile and he was transported to the Trenton Police Department, said Chief Sanders. Officers notified investigator Lieutenant James Wilson for further investigation. The investigations lead to charging the juvenile with burglary. The juvenile was cited into juvenile court and released back into the custody of his mother.

After returning back on patrol Officer Will Williams found the front door glass of the Little General Store, located on Armory Street broken out. The investigation into the burglary of the Little General Store has lead to the arrest of Robert Brown, 18 years of age, who listed an address of 105 Park Street in Trenton.

The investigations into the burglary of the Co-Op and the Little General have lead to solving the burglary at Bell Screen Printing and the attempted burglary of CVS Pharmacy on March 2, 2008.

Robert Brown has been charged with 2 counts of Burglary and his bond was set at \$10,000.00 and he is to appear in Trenton Municipal Court on March 14, 2008.

Lieutenant Vickers, Patrol Officers Williams and Robertiello and Lieutenant James Wilson will be commended on the excellent work they exhibited, with a letter of commendation being placed in each of their personnel files, said Chief Sanders
